Our Super Special Reader program will continue in April. The children really enjoy when you come in to read and they are always excited to see what the story will be.

May is our last month together and the children will be making use of creation station, planting seeds, and hopefully enjoying the warmer weather.

Pre-K

The children have been exploring a variety of fabrics, uniforms, notions, and weaving during the clothing study. They have discussed what, when, and why they wear certain clothes. They created a weaving for the bulletin board when delving into how fabric is made and also designed a little t-shirt using the same method on a smaller scale. They graphed pockets, zippers, and buttons and drew in their journal about clothes they wear for a special occasion. The A-B-C journals are coming along nicely. We look forward to April and visiting a dairy farm and looking for signs of spring. Our final month will be spent studying the deep blue ocean.

#### **Kindergarten Enrichment**

April will take our class to our final continent – Australia! We will learn about Pangea and how all the continents fit together. This will help to explain why such unusual animals are found in Australia. The kids will learn about marsupials and why they are only found on this continent. We will also study the native Aboriginal people of Australia. The kids will see their "white dot" method of painting and do some of their own. After learning about the Sydney Opera House and what makes it so special, the kids will attempt to build their own one of a kind structure.

In May, we will be looking at different kinds of maps. The kids will learn about topographic maps, weather maps, relief maps, and road maps. We will make maps of neighborhoods, schools, backyards, and houses.

During both April and May we will be watching our ladybugs grow from larva to pupa to adult bugs. The kids will be recording the progress in their science journals.
