As we all know, our children are always watching us. They know when we are upset, stressed, or even just tired. They are very perceptive. We can run, but we cannot hide from these very human emotions. After all, we are only human. But, there are ways we can help our children get through the holidays without feeling stressed about all the busy things we need to do.

The main problem for children is the interruption in their routine. They are out of school, going to bed late, traveling to visit friends and relatives. When children feel stressed and/or tired we see an increase in irritability. We need to be realistic of our expectations of our children over the holidays. We can prevent a lot of problems if we do a few simple things in advance. One, prepare children for the change in their routine. Tell them ahead of time of your plan to travel, who's house you will be going to and what the differences are between the rules at your house and those at someone else's house. Make them part of the plan. Children are better able to cope with change when they are prepared in advance. Second, let them help. Children love being involved. Things matter more to them when they can claim ownership of something. Let them help decorate, bake and even participate in your charitable donations. Third, be willing to change or modify some of your holiday traditions if it means making something more fun for the young people in your life. Be open to change and establishing new traditions. Fourth, be sure not to overbook your children, pair busy days with days where you just stay home. If you travel a lot over the holidays be sure the days you are home are not days filled with running errands. Slow down and give your children a chance to catch up. Remember to make festivities fun for kids because they are not little adults. Fifth, explain to them the meaning of your holiday celebrations. Children love to learn about everything. Look at every moment as a teachable moment. Because when children are young every moment is a teachable moment. Last and most importantly, remember to laugh and have fun.

Kindergarten Enrichment

Kindergarten Enrichment explored Antarctica in December. We did a hands-on experiment to better understand how blubber helps Antarctic animals survive in the cold. We also spent time learning more about penguins. Are you taller than an Emperor Penguin? Some of our kindergarten students are! The children measured and compared their height to that of an Emperor Penguin. Our study of Antarctica concluded by learning about snow crystals and how they form. The children helped to create a supersaturated solution and grew their own crystals. December was a short month but full of activity in Kindergarten Enrichment!

January will take us all the way to Africa. Our study of Africa begins in Egypt, learning about hieroglyphics and pyramids. The children will write their own document using hieroglyphs. Next, we will learn about the African Savannah and create a savannah of our own for the hallway. Finally, we will learn about some of the tribal cultures in Africa and create masks resembling those of a tribe from Ghana. We will wrap up January by talking about the states of matter and the concept of polymers in one of our most popular science projects - making slime!
